The TEXTILES GCSE is an Art & Design qualification that provides students with the opportunity to explore and experiment with techniques to manipulate a variety of materials and fabric. Students will be taught through a variety of tutorials to develop their practical skills, knowledge and understanding. This course is 100% coursework divided over two portfolios of work completed in Year 10 and Year 11.

Students are exposed to a range of themes and topics that are designed to inspire and challenge them to create new and unique ideas and outcomes that reflect their creativity in a textile form.

Students will present their work in both 2d and 3d forms. They will create visual portfolios that demonstrates their understanding for how textile design can be incorporated into a diverse range of areas such as constructed textiles, fashion design, installed textiles, soft furnishings etc.

Year 10:

Year 11:

- Complete the coursework portfolio.
- Complete the set task portfolio worth 40% of the GCSE grade.

Throughout this course students will have access to a wide range of resources and specialist input giving them lots of opportunity to achieve and exceed their target grade.
