Keyword	Definition	Revised
<b>PRAYER</b>		
1 Prayer	The raising of the heart and mind to <i>God</i>	
2 Adoration	A type of prayer that praises <i>God</i> .	
3 Contrition	A type of prayer that says sorry to <i>God</i> for any wrongdoing.	
4 Thanksgiving	A type of prayer that says thank you to <i>God</i> .	
5 Supplication	A type of prayer that asks <i>God</i> for things.	
6. Traditional Prayer	When a person uses a prayer that has been written and passed down by others.	
<b>THE SACRAMENTS</b>		
7 Sacraments	An visible sign of <i>God's</i> invisible grace.	
8 Sacraments of Initiation	The three sacraments that make a person a full member of the Catholic Church: baptism, Holy Communion and confirmation.	
<b>LENT AND EASTER</b>		
9 Holy Week	The last week of <i>Jesus'</i> life.	
10 Palm Sunday	The first day of Holy Week when <i>Jesus</i> entered Jerusalem on a donkey.	
11 Maundy Thursday	The Thursday of Holy Week when <i>Jesus</i> ate his last supper with the disciples and instituted (started) the Eucharist (Holy Communion).	
12 Good Friday	The last day of Holy Week when <i>Jesus</i> was crucified and died on the cross.	
<b>THE LIFE OF JESUS</b>		
13. Annunciation	When the angel <i>Gabriel</i> visited <i>Mary</i> to tell her she would be the	

	mother of <i>God</i> and that she was to call him <i>Jesus</i> .	
<b>JUDAISM</b>		
14 Kosher	Food that meets the requirements of Jewish law; foods that Jews are allowed to eat.	
15 Shekinah	The divine presence of <i>God</i> .	
<b>GOD</b>		
16 Religious upbringing	When parents bring their children up to follow the same faith that they do. A Catholic upbringing involves being baptised, going to Mass, going to a Catholic school and being part of a Catholic community.	
17 Religious experience	When someone feels that they have had a direct, personal experience of <i>God</i> .	
18 Pilgrimage	A journey undertaken, often to a sacred place. To strengthen your faith.	
19 Trinity	The Christian belief that there is one <i>God</i> who reveals himself as three persons.	
<b>CREATION AND STEWARDSHIP</b>		
20 Myth	A story that intends to convey a deep truth or message, but not in a literal way.	
21 Stewardship	Humans have a duty to look after the environment on behalf of <i>God</i> .	
<b>ISLAM</b>		
22 The Five Pillars	The five most important duties for all Muslims: to believe, to pray, to give to charity, to fast and to go on pilgrimage.	
<b>CRIME AND PUNISHMENT</b>		
23 Crime	An action that goes against the law of a country/government.	
24 Sin	An action that goes against the law of <i>God</i> .	
25 Forgiveness	Showing grace (love) and mercy (forgiveness); pardoning someone for what they have done wrong.	
26 Capital punishment	When someone is given a punishment that ends their life.
