


Outstanding


Advent is a time of expectant waiting, hopeful anticipation and cheerful preparation...ready to welcome a special guest, Jesus.

OUTREACH WORK




Our Christmas Appeal for 2021 once again focused on supporting the Home for Good Appeal, with our outreach work going towards helping children in care.



THE MONTH OF REMEMBRANCE




On Thursday 11th November, at 11.00 am, the college fell silent for 2 minutes.

COP stands for conference of the parties under this agreement.

This year is the 26th COP meeting and will be hosted by the UK in Glasgow.

Instil in them the courage and gentleness to implement fairer solutions


for the poorest and most vulnerable, and commit their nations to the care of Our Common Home.

We ask this through Our Lord Jesus Christ your Son.



Finally, our SVP have also recently voted on their new leadership positions which are as follows -


