Year 8 Geography Assessment 2

Skills being tested

The Year 8 assessment test students' ability to both recall their knowledge of the topics they have studied but also to develop their extended writing skills.

The following Assessment Objectives will be assessed:

AO1: Knowledge of places and locations

AO2: Understanding of patterns, processes and environmental change

AO3: Application of knowledge and understanding

AO4: Geographical skills

The structure of the assessment

There are 5 sections to the assessment, and students should complete all of them. The structure of this assessment is the same as Assessment 1. The total is out of 50 marks.

Section A – Knowledge recall from Year 8 topics (10 marks)

- Skills assessed will be AO1 and AO4
- Use the map extracts to help you answer the relevant questions
- The questions will be a range of multiple choice and short answer questions.

Section B Globalisation (12 marks)

- Skills assessed will be AO2 and AO3
- In question 3 you need to use your knowledge to explain how employment changes in different countries over time. Use the resource to help you.
- In question 5 you need to give 3 PEE points to explain the factors that have led to country's producing products. You will be expected to write two paragraphs.

Section C Settlement & Urbanisation (8 marks)

- Skills assessed AO1 and AO2
- In question 4 you will need to use your own knowledge and the source provided to help you.

Section D – Coasts (10 marks)

- Skills assessed AO1, AO2 and AO3
- In question 3 you will need to give both the advantages and disadvantages of a management strategy. You will be expected to write at least two paragraphs and make a judgement on its overall success.

Section E – Glaciation (10 marks)

- Skills assessed AO2 and AO3
- In question 3 you will need to explain the different processes that have occurred to create a glacial landform. You will be expected to use the correct key terminology to explain its formation.

What to revise

Knowledge recall – Rivers and Population.

Globalisation – Employment structure, infrastructure, exports and reasons for industry in EDCs.

Settlement & urbanisation – Settlement hierarchy, Early settlers and informal settlements.

Coasts- Weathering, longshore drift, depositional landforms and coastal management.

Glaciation – Glaciers, glacial erosion, glacial landforms and their formation
