Pentecost was celebrated on the Sunday the 5th of June. In College we marked the occasion through our daily Collective Act of Worship.



Do we have the confidence and courage to stand up for own beliefs and display our faith?






Pupil Reception

Prayers in RE lessons and our daily Collective Acts of Worship are also on a green background to remind students of the liturgical calendar that we follow in school.






Staff Prayers

Srebrenica Memorial

On Monday 11th July 11, Mrs Apps and Year 9 students took part in the Remembering Srebrenica event at the Guildhall. In 1995 8, 375 mostly Muslim men and boys were killed in the Srebrenica genocide. The United Nations described it as 'the worst crime on European soil since the Second World War.' During the event we were reminded of the importance of making sure everyone is treated fairly and about standing up for injustice. Imam Sayid Khalil talked about the importance of remembering, that first and foremost, we are all human beings who should show love to one another. Ms Selma Bektic shared the story of her family who survived the genocide but also told us that 100 members of her family lost their lives in 1995 in Srebrenica. Along with members of other world faiths, we were able to remember the victims of the genocide.

Staff Walking Weekend

On Friday the 8th- Sunday 10th July members of Blessed Edward's staff were invited to a weekend away in Wales. They enjoyed a meal together and tackled a 6 hour round trip up Pen y Fan! It was a perfect way to end a busy year by spending time with those we work closely with, making time for nature and to come back to God. 
Prayer Stations
