You will need to know these keywords for your recall test.

Keyword	Definition
1 Omnipotent	The belief that God is all-powerful.
2 Omniscient	The belief that God is all-knowing.
3 Omnibenevolent	The belief that God is all-powerful.
4 Transcendent	The belief that God exists outside of time and space.
5 Immanent	The belief that God is involved with his creation and that we can have a personal relationship with him.
6 Incarnation	The belief that Jesus is God 'in flesh'.
7 Covenant	Promise or agreement made between people or God and his people.
8 Discrimination	The unjust treatment of different categories of people, especially on the grounds of race, age, or gender
9 Dignity	To be worthy of honour and respect.
10 Sacred	Holy
11 Prejudice	Judging someone before you know them.
12 Imago Dei	Humans were made in the image of God.
13 Sanctity of Life	All human life is holy because it was created by God.
14 Inherent dignity	Inner dignity which we are born with, having been created in the image of God; this cannot be taken away.
15 Heaven	A state of being eternally in the presence of God after death
16 Hell	Being eternally separated from God.
17 Purgatory	A place where the soul has gone to be cleansed of sins before heaven.
18 Soul	The spiritual part of us that makes us unique, given by God
19 Reincarnation	The rebirth of the soul into another body
20 Humanism	An atheist belief system which gives importance to human life and happiness
21 Eschatology	Concerned with death, judgement and the final destination of the soul.
22 Resurrection	The rising of the dead at the last judgement, Jesus resurrected when He

	rose from the dead.
23 Paschal Candle	The candle used in baptism and at Easter.
24 Pall	Covers the coffin in a funeral.
25 Just	What is right and fair.
26 Moral evil	Evil and suffering caused by the actions of humans.
27 Natural evil	Evil and suffering caused by natural disasters.
28 Synagogue	House of assembly; building for Jewish public prayer, study and assembly.
29 Ner Tamid	The everlasting light, it hangs over the Ark to represent God's eternal presence.
30 Bimah	This is the stand where the Torah scrolls are read from.

Key facts:

<p>1 The big bang and evolution are scientific theories of creation. Some people believe that because science can explain creation, this proves there is no God. Catholics believe that God is the cause of the big bang and evolution. Pope Francis said we need science to understand how God created the world.</p>
<p>2 Christians believe that the Son of God (the second person of the Trinity) became human in Jesus. He did this so that he could bring humans back into a relationship with God like it was when God first created humans. God did this because he loves us.</p>
<p>3 Christians believe in heaven, hell and purgatory. Christians believe that Jesus' resurrection is proof that there is a life after death. Jesus' parables also help us to understand what will happen after death, for example the Parable of the Sheep and the Goats and the Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus.</p>
<p>4 A Catholic funeral Mass is often called a requiem, this means the Mass for the dead.</p>
<p>5 At a Catholic funeral Mass, a white cloth placed on the coffin called a 'pall' and the holy water are reminders of baptism. The Paschal candle is a symbol of Jesus' resurrection. Incense symbolises the prayers rising up to God. Prayers and readings will also be said to give those who are grieving hope that their loved one is with God.</p>
<p>6 The sanctity of life principle means that all life is sacred because it was created by God. The Bible tells Christians that life is sacred because in Genesis 1 it says God created all life and in the 10 Commandments it says 'Do not kill'.</p>
<p>7 Euthanasia means helping someone who is terminally ill to die with dignity. There are different types of euthanasia; voluntary, involuntary, active and passive. Catholics believe that euthanasia is wrong because only God can end life.</p>
<p>8 Catholics believe life begins at the moment of conception. This means abortion is wrong.</p>

Catholics are pro-life. Other people are pro-choice, which means that they think it is up to the woman whether to have an abortion or not.

9 Moses is an important prophet in Judaism because he was chosen by God to free the Israelites from slavery. God sent 10 plagues to Egypt to try to make the pharaoh set the Israelites free. The final plague was the angel of death. The Israelites painted lambs blood on their doorposts so the angel of death would pass over them and only kill the firstborn sons of the Egyptians. Jews remember this each year during the festival Passover (Pesach).

10 Jews believe in one God who is the judge, creator and lawgiver. Jews believe that God has given them 613 mitzvot (commandments) to follow. These are found in the Torah which are the five books of Moses. Jews believe God gave Moses the Torah on Mount Sinai after he had freed the Israelites from slavery.
