Keyword	Definition
1 Omnipotent	The belief that God is all-powerful.
2 Omniscient	The belief that God is all-knowing.
3 Omnibenevolent	The belief that God is all-powerful.
4 Transcendent	The belief that God exists outside of time and space.
5 Immanent	The belief that God is involved with his creation and that we can have a personal relationship with him.
6 Denomination	A branch of the Christian Church
7 Sacraments	Sacraments are an outward sign of inward grace.
8 Abrahamic Faiths	The world faiths that trace their beginnings back to Abraham in the Old Testament: Judaism, Christianity and Islam.
9 Incarnation	The belief that Jesus is God made flesh so is fully human and fully divine
10 Pentecost	The Christian festival celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples after Jesus ascended to heaven.
11 Genesis	Genesis means the beginning. For example, Genesis is the first book in the Bible.
12 Ex Nihilo	Creation out of nothing.
13 Big Bang	The belief that the Universe was created by a singularity which expanded to create the Universe (which is still expanding today).
14 Imago Dei	The belief that God made everyone in his image.
15 Laudato Si	A letter written by Pope Francis claiming it is everyone's responsibility to care for the environment
16 Body of Christ	1.The unleavened bread becomes the Body of Christ in Mass when the priest reenacts the Last Supper. 2.The members of the Church who try to live like Jesus did and continue his work.
17 Conscience	a inner sense of right and wrong, a voice of God within us
18 Sanctity of Life	The Christian belief that life is precious or sacred because it has been given to us by God.
19 Catholic	A set of teachings in the Catholic Church that are based on the Bible and

Social Teaching	teach Catholics how to treat others and the environment,
20 Humanism	A world view that emphasises the importance of human beings and does not believe in a divine creator.
21 Holy Week	The week leading up to the death and resurrection of Jesus.
22 Paschal Mystery	This is the story of Jesus Christ's arrest, trial and suffering, death, and resurrection.
23 Salvation	To be saved from sin through the suffering and death of Christ.
24 Annunciation	When the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary telling her she was to be the mother of Jesus.
25 10 Commandments	Ten rules given by God to Moses on Mount Sinai.
26 Sabbath	The day of rest and spiritual renewal for Jews that begins at dusk on Friday and lasts for 25 hours.
27 Pilgrimage	A journey undertaken, often to a sacred place to strengthen your faith.
28 Disciples	A follower of Jesus Christ.
29 Discipleship	Following Jesus' teachings like the disciples did.
30 Serve	To perform duties or services for others.

Key facts:

1 Catholics believe that everyone has a vocation (a calling from God). Some people are called to the religious life. Those that are called to the religious life can become priests, monks or nuns.
2 The Catholic Church is unique because Catholics pray to Mary, believe in transubstantiation (the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ), have seven sacraments and follow the Pope who is the Head of the Catholic Church.
3 In the Book of Genesis there are two creation stories. Genesis 1 describes the six days of creation with God resting on day 7. Genesis 2 focuses on the creation of humans and the Garden of Eden.
4 Catholic Christians do not believe Genesis 1 and 2 are literal accounts of creation. They are stories with a deeper meaning containing theological truths (truths about God).
5 Catholic Christians believe that God created the world using the Big Bang and created humans using evolution.
6 The last week of Jesus' life is called Holy Week. Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday where we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. It ends on Good Friday when Jesus died on the cross to save humans from sin.

7 The stations of the cross are 14 pictures of Jesus' death. The pictures tell us what happened to Jesus at his crucifixion. They start from his trial by Pontius Pilate. Sometimes there are more pictures because they show Jesus being Resurrected. You can find them in Churches

8 When Catholics celebrate Mass they believe that the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is called transubstantiation. The priest uses the same words that Jesus used at the Last Supper when he blesses the bread and wine. We say that the priest is reenacting the Last Supper.

9 Social injustice is when people are not treated fairly in society. One way Catholics try to make sure everyone is treated fairly is by following the Catholic Social Teachings. Catholics also follow the teachings of Jesus. Jesus taught us to treat everyone fairly. In the Parable of the sheep and the goats Jesus said that when we help those in need we are also helping God.

10 Humanists do not believe in God and do not have a holy book like the Bible. Humanists value traits like reason and rely on science to explain the way things are.
