

Lesson 15. Chapter 10: Turning Point - 'New Servitude'

- This chapter fast-forwards 8 years. Jane is now aged 18.
- Jane has spent 5 years as a student and 2 years as a teacher at Lowood.
- Lowood drastically improves after the typhus outbreak and Jane excels in her education.
- Jane has a close **maternal** bond with Miss Temple. Miss Temple leaves Lowood which creates another turning point for Jane: Jane seeks a new job as a **governess**.

Servitude: to serve someone, job, occupation **Governess:** a live-in Victorian female teacher or tutor.
Maternal: motherly, protective, caring

10	5	Jane arrives at... Lowood School which is a school for poor girls or Orphans. The school is a <u>charity school</u> but is also <u>strict</u> and <u>harsh</u> <u>orphan, charity, harsh, strict, deprive</u>
	6	Jane meets her new friend... Helen Burns who is <u>stoic</u> and a <u>foil</u> to Jane. Helen teaches Jane to <u>love your enemies</u> and to <u>forbear</u> her punishments. <u>stoic, antithesis, foil, forbear/ance, love your enemies</u>
10	7	Mr Brocklehurst ... <u>mortifies</u> Jane by putting her on a stool and telling everyone that she is <u>deceitful</u> . Jane <u>matures</u> by forbearing her punishment and does not retaliate. <u>mortify/ies, deceit/ful, mature/ing,</u>
	8	Miss Temple... <u>vindicates</u> Jane which is a <u>turning point</u> for Jane, she now loves Lowood School, she shows <u>maturing</u> when she stands up for herself <u>vindicates, mature/maturing, turning point</u>
10-15	9	Typhus ... Helen Burns... <u>epidemic/outbreak, pathos, stoic/ally, afterlife</u>
16-18	10	Teenage Jane is employed... <u>maternal, turning point, governess, servitude</u>
