

Lesson 15. Chapter 10: Turning Point - 'New Servitude'

- This chapter fast-forwards 8 years. Jane is now aged 18.
- Jane has spent 5 years as a student and 2 years as a teacher at Lowood teacher.
- Lowood drastically improves after the typhus outbreak and Jane excels in her education.
- Jane has a close **maternal** bond with Miss Temple. Miss Temple leaves Lowood which creates another turning point for Jane: Jane seeks a new job as a **governess**.

Servitude: to serve someone, job, occupation

Governess: a live-in Victorian female teacher or tutor.

Maternal: motherly, protective, caring

10	5	Jane arrives at... Lowood school and she finds it harsh and strict and deprives the girls of their basic needs to make them numble orphan, charity, harsh, strict, deprive
	6	Jane meets her new friend... Helen . Helen is presented as a stoic character. She is a foil to Jane. Helen's purpose to Jane is to teach her to love your enemies and forbear stoic, antithesis, foil, forbear/ance, love your enemies
10	7	Mr Brocklehurst ... mortifies Jane. Brocklehurst mortifies Jane for being deceitful by making her stand on the stool. Therefore Jane is maturing because of Helen's positive Christian influence . mortify/ies, deceit/ful, mature/ing,
	8	Miss Temple ... vindicates Jane which is a turning point for Jane because she now fully begins to appreciate Lowood school . Jane shows another sign of maturing when she defends herself. vindicates, mature/maturing, turning point
10-15	9	Typhus ... epidemic breaks out at Lowood school killing 50% of the malnourished Lowood girls Helen Burns ... is a bildungsroman turning point for Jane Helen teaches Jane about everlasting life with God in heaven . epidemic/outbreak, pathos, stoic/ally, afterlife
16-18	10	Teenage Jane is employed... Jane has a close maternal bond with Miss Temple . Miss Temple leaves Lowood which creates another turning point for Jane: Jane seeks a new job as a governess maternal, turning point, governess, servitude
