Keyword	Definition
WHAT ARE BIG QUESTIONS?	
1 Morals	Standards of behaviour; principles of right and wrong.
2 Omnibenevolent	The belief that God is all-loving.
3 Omnipotent	The belief that God is all-powerful.
4 Omniscient	The belief that God is all-knowing/seeing.
5 Sanctity of Life	The Christian belief that life is precious or sacred because it has been given to us by God.
6 Transcendent	The belief that God exists outside of time and space.
7 Immanent	The belief that God is involved with his creation and that we can have a personal relationship with him.
8 Conscience	a inner sense of right and wrong, a voice of God within us
WHAT IS CHRISTIANITY?	
9 Sacraments	Sacraments are an outward sign of inward grace.
10 Abrahamic faiths	A faith (religion) which comes from the line of Abraham, namely: Judaism, Christianity and Islam.
11 Incarnation	The belief that Jesus is God made flesh so is fully human and fully divine
12 catholic	Means universal; the Catholic Church is universal.

13 Evolution	The way that living things change over time through the process of natural selection.
14 Big Bang	The belief that the Universe was created by a singularity which expanded to create the Universe (which is still expanding today).
15 Image Dei	The belief that God made everyone in his image.
16 Ex Nihilo	Creation out of nothing.

17 Vocation	A calling from God, possibly to a job that helps others.
18 Holy Week	The week leading up to the death and resurrection of Jesus.

19 Interfaith Dialogue	When people of different faiths work together to find common ground
20 Catholic Social Teaching	A set of teachings in the Catholic Church that are based on the Bible and teach Catholics how to treat others and the environment,
21 Social Justice	Ensuring everyone is treated fairly and equally in society
