Remember the PEEI formula means:

P - make a point

E - explain your point

E - use evidence to support your point

1 Omnibenevolent	The belief that God is all-loving.
2 Omnipotent	The belief that God is all-knowing.
3 Omniscient	The belief that God is all-powerful.
4 Sanctity of Life	The Christian belief that life is precious or sacred because it has been given to us by God.
5 Transcendent	The belief that God exists outside of time and space.
6 Immanent	The belief that God is involved with his creation and that we can have a personal relationship with him.
<b>CRIME AND PUNISHMENT</b>	
7. Justice	The righting of a wrong - administering the law fairly
8. Reform	An aim of punishment to change and rehabilitate the criminal
<b>HOW CAN I BELIEVE IN GOD?</b>	
9 Theist	A person who believes in God.
10 Atheist	A person who does not believe in God.
11 Conversion	When a person moves from a position of atheism or agnosticism to theism.

12 Abortion	A medical process of ending a pregnancy.
13 Dignity	To be worthy of honour and respect.
14 Sacred	Sacred means something is holy or treated with great respect
15 Hospice	A place that cares for the terminally ill.
16 Imago Dei	To be made in the image of God
17 Sanctity	Being sacred or holy
18 Euthanasia	Painless killing of someone who is suffering to help them to die with dignity.
19 Palliative care	The act of looking after people at the end of their lives.
20 Inherent dignity	Inner dignity which we are born with, having been created in the image of God; this cannot be taken away.

21 Catholic Social Teaching	A set of teachings in the Catholic Church that are based on the Bible and teach Catholics how to treat others and the environment,

22 Heaven	A state of being eternally in the presence of God after death
23 Hell	Being eternally separated from God.
24 Purgatory	A place where the soul has gone to be cleansed of sins before heaven.
25 Eschatology	Concerned with death, judgement and the final destination of the soul.
26 Resurrection	The rising of the dead at the last judgement, Jesus resurrected when He rose from the dead.
27 Paschal Candle	The candle used in baptism and at Easter.
28 Pall	Covers the coffin in a funeral.
29. Reincarnation	The rebirth of the soul into another body.

30 Just War Theory	The theory specifies conditions for judging if it is just to go to war, and conditions for how the war should be fought.
