5th Sunday of Easter: Jesus, The Way, The Truth, The Life:

As plants grow in the Spring sunshine consider how the stem and its leaves are inter-connected – one cannot thrive without the other. Today Jesus uses the plant metaphor as he teaches that He is the vine and that his disciples are the branches.



The goal of our life of prayer is to increase our awareness that Jesus lives with us always. Prayer is more than a dialogue with God; prayer is a lifting of our minds and hearts to God so that God might dwell and act within us and through us. The pinnacle of our life of prayer is our communion with Jesus in the Eucharist. Through this sacrament, we receive Jesus himself, and he remains with us.

In today's world Jesus invites us, as his disciples, to relate to Him in prayer, Scripture, the Eucharist, and so on. When we do these things, Jesus promises to remain with us and to lead us to serve others well.

May the Month of Mary:

The month of May is the month which is especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady, and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pray to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

Perhaps you can, in your homes, make a special shrine for Mary and offer prayers there during May. Perhaps offer the rosary once a day at the shrine for the problems facing the world and the Church.
