Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Acts 1:15-17.20-26; Psalm 102; 1 John 4:11-16; John 17:11-19 My dear friends, on this Sixth Sunday of Easter takes us further into the Gospel of John with Jesus' Last Supper discourse. So last week we were looking at the famous image of the vine and the branches, and this Sunday the gospel picks up right where last week left off and continues into Jesus' teaching on the new commandment, the commandment to love one another as he has loved us. A monk was walking on the beach, he saw a scorpion being carried away by the waves in the ocean. He bent down and used his bare hand to save the drawing scorpion. But he was stung by the scorpion. As a reflex he threw the scorpion back to the waters and began to nurse his finger. He went down for the second time and a third time he was stung by the scorpion, he was not spared. A man who watched this said to the monk "My friend, are you out of your mind? You were trying to save the scorpion three times and it stung you three times. Yet you are going down for the fourth time to rescue this ungrateful creature. The monk said in reply, "it is the nature of the scorpion to sting, while it is the nature of the monk is to love and save this drawing scorpion." This story tells us that we should not allow the bitterness of someone to take away our sweetness.

In the context of Last Supper, Jesus is taking the analogy of the vine and the branches even further and giving us an image for what it means to abide in him and what it means to bear fruit, with a particular focus on love. There are three kinds of love expressed by human person. First, erotic love which is sensual or carnal love. Second, filial love: love between parents and children. Thirdly, agapē which in Greek is sacrificial love. This agapē is that what Jesus is calling his disciples to carry out and to emulate in Him. So, he says if you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I who kept the father's commandments and abide in his love. St. Thomas Aquinas in his famous Summa Theologica, defines love — caritas in Latin or agapē in Greek. He says, "...to love a person is to wish that person good or some translations have "to will the good for another." So, love isn't just an emotion but It's a choice. It's an act of the will to choose the good for another and that's exactly what God does, in the Incarnation and in the Passion.

St. Thomas Aquinas beautifully explains this love in his Summa Theologica. He says, "It seems that it was not necessary for the reparation of humanity that the Word of God should become incarnate... for God of His omnipotent power could have restored human nature in many other ways... but the reason He saves the world through the Incarnation and through the Passion is because both of these mysteries best and most fully reveal the love of God for humanity" St. Thomas (following St. Augustine) says, "that God could have simply declared us all to be forgiven, like a judge might say "not guilty". But God doesn't just want to save us from Hell. He wants to unite us with Him. He wants to bring us into divine life of the blessed Trinity, which is a relationship of love. So it's fitting, Thomas said, "that God would come to us in the Incarnation and become fully human in order to show us the proof of His love for us, that He loved us so much that He became one of us in order to lead us and journey with us back to the life of God, back to the mystery of the Trinity, back to the Father and to the love from which we fell". So, the Incarnation, should move us to love God in return, out of gratitude for the love that He showed us. That's what salvation is all about. It's not about not going to Hell. It's about loving God, so the Incarnation is a motive for humanity to love God in return — a God who loved us so much that He emptied Himself of His divine glory and became fully human... assumed our humanity to redeem us and then to bring us back to God. What a wonderful love.
