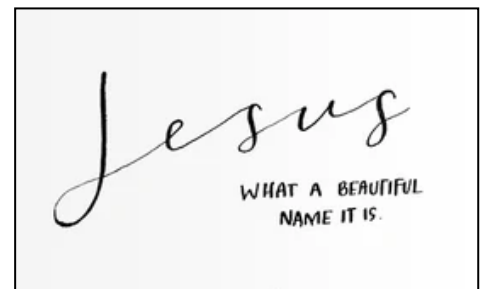

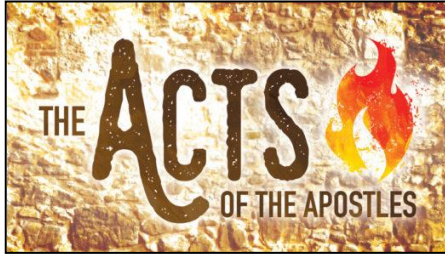

We therefore ask Mary, to pray with us and for us as we all say together –

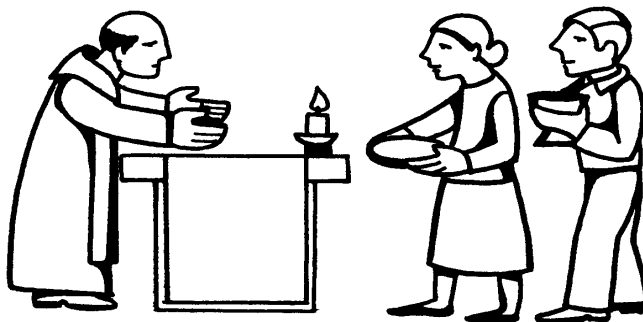

Eucharistic Prayer III

Bishop: You are indeed Holy, O Lord,

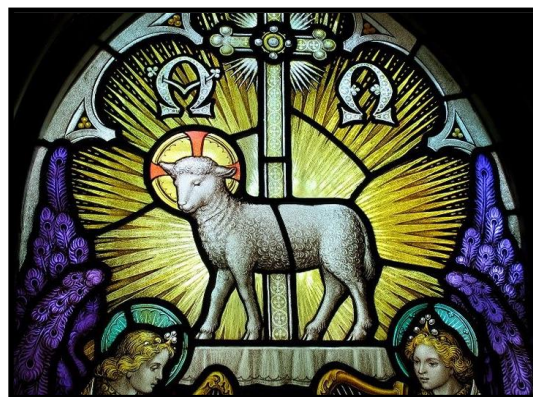

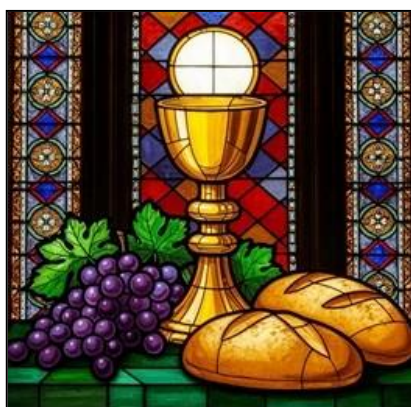
## **INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

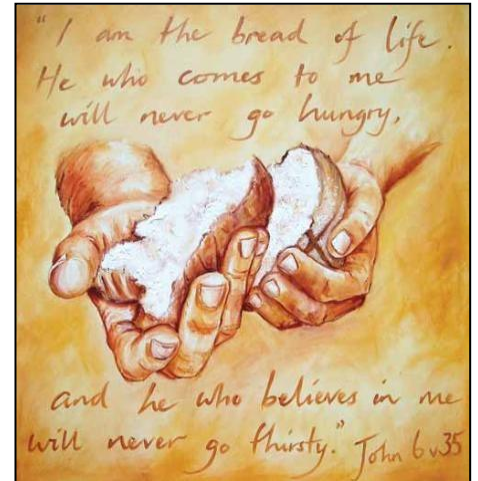

## **THE CREED**
