

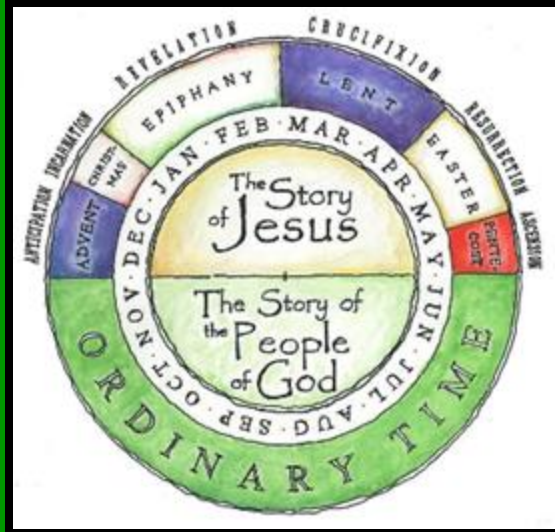

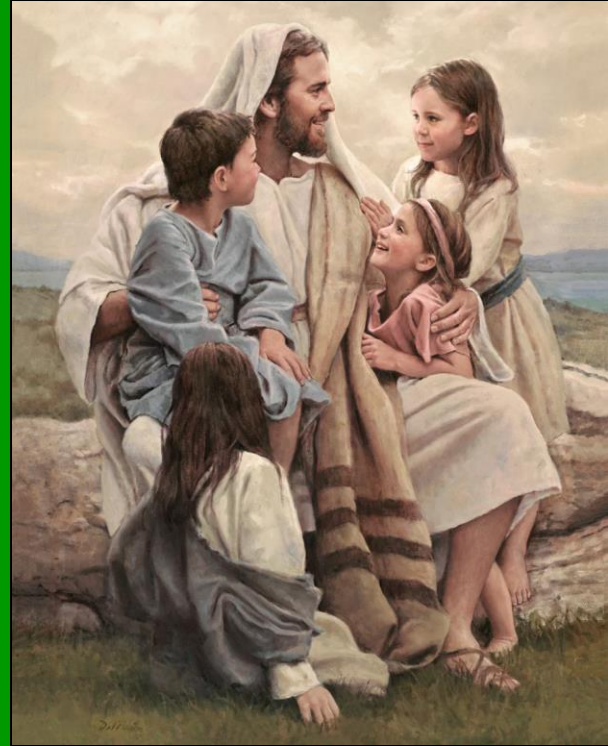
JESUS WELCOMES CHILDREN

"Let the little children come to me. Don't stop them, because the kingdom of heaven belongs to people who are like these children."

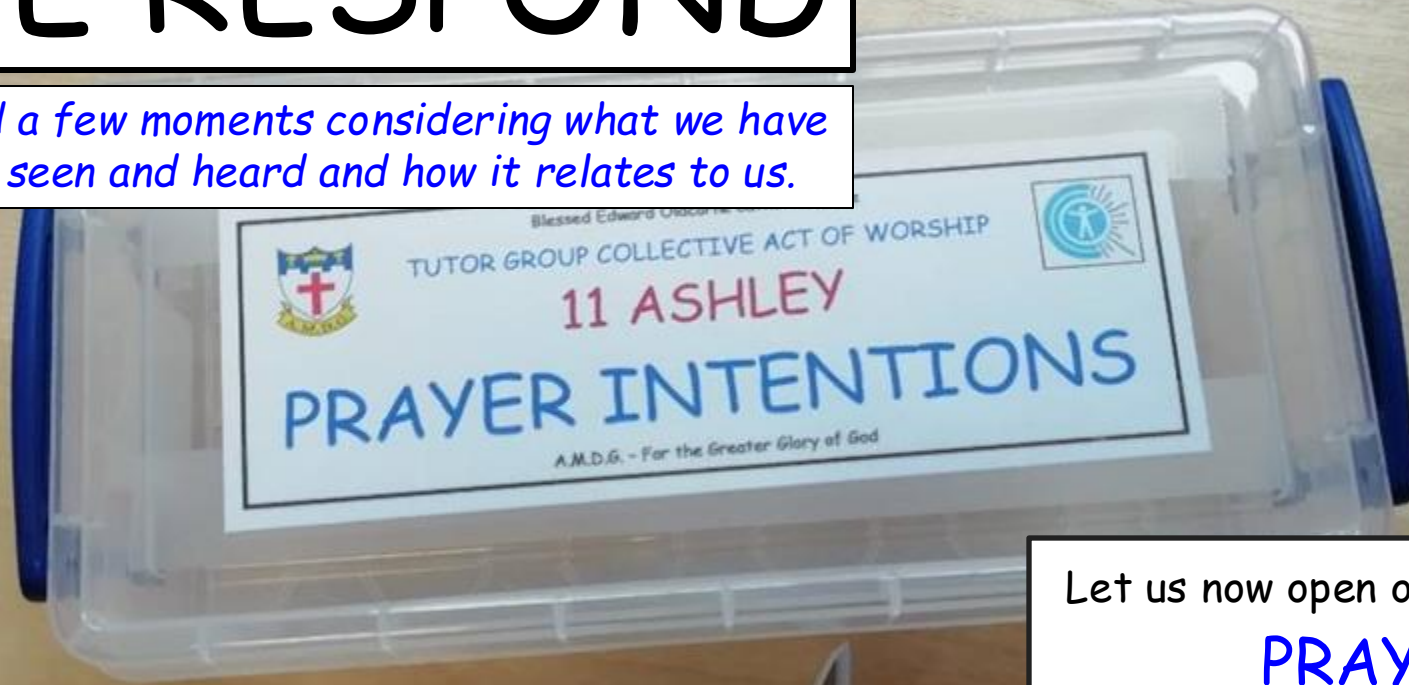
