



# SAINT Carlo Acutis - canonised yesterday!



*"Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity."*



**Saint Carlo Acutis, a teenager who died at just 15 from leukemia, has become a beacon of holiness for the digital age. Known as "God's influencer," Carlo used his love for computers and coding to create a website cataloguing Eucharistic miracles, making the beauty of the Catholic faith accessible to millions online.**

**His canonisation reminds us that holiness is not reserved for the past, nor for the old and wise. It is a call for every generation, especially the young, to live with purpose, joy, and devotion. Carlo's life was marked by daily Mass, Eucharistic adoration, acts of charity, and a deep love for Christ. He once said, "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven."**






Saint Paul wrote a famous passage about love in his letter to the Corinthians, it is often used at weddings.

Friends are patient and kind; they are not jealous or boastful; they are not arrogant or rude.




# THE WORD

but they are pleased with what is good and right.


Friends are always ready to excuse,








## The Most Holy Name of Mary Memorial Day

This feast day honours Mary,

## WHY IS MARY IMPORTANT TODAY?

Mary has always been a central figure in Christianity. She's always been key, right from that moment early in Luke's Gospel when she's told, "Blessed are you amongst women".

She said "yes" to God!

Remember she would have only been 13 or 14 when she was pregnant with Jesus, and she was unmarried.

She also plays an important role in providing us with a female that's right at the heart of events.

Christianity can seem fairly male-dominated, but in Mary we have somebody who women can relate to!






# THE WORD

He was born in 347 AD in Antioch, Turkey and died on September 14th 407 at the age of 58 years in Turkey.

We celebrate his feast day on 13<sup>th</sup> September every year in the Catholic Church.

## Saint John Chrysostom

was perhaps the greatest preacher in the history of the Church

He was concerned above all for the spiritual and temporal welfare of the needy and oppressed.

- Constantinople






The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates two historical events:





Please free my thinking and feelings and the thinking and feelings of others, from all forms of self-will, self-centeredness, dishonesty, and deception.




