




Evangelii Gaudium is a 2013 apostolic exhortation by the late Pope Francis and translates as The Joy of the Gospel.


### THE WORD





## THE WORD



In <u>Walsingham there is Catholic shrine</u> dedicated to Mary, the Mother of Jesus. It is a popular place of pilgrimage in the UK.

The shrine was established in 1061 when Richeldis de Faverches prayed she might undertake special work in honour of Our Lady.

The Virgin Mary led her in spirit to Nazareth, showing her the house where the Annunciation occurred, and asked her to <u>build a replica</u> in Walsingham to serve as a perpetual memorial of the Annunciation.
