





He left behind his job, wealth, and his comfort to walk with Christ. This moment reminds us that God's call is not based on our past, but on His purpose for our future. Matthew went on to become one of the twelve apostles and the author of one of the Gospels - a Gospel that continues to guide and inspire millions.

St. Francis of Assisi is one of the most beloved saints in Christian history—not because he held power or wealth, but because he gave it all up to follow Christ more closely. Born into a wealthy family, Francis chose a life of radical simplicity, humility, and joy. He saw God's presence in all of creation—in the poor, in animals, in the beauty of the earth.

Francis reminds us that true richness is found not in possessions, but in love—love for God, for others, and for the world around us. His life challenges us to let go of what distracts us from God and to embrace a life of peace, compassion, and service.
