

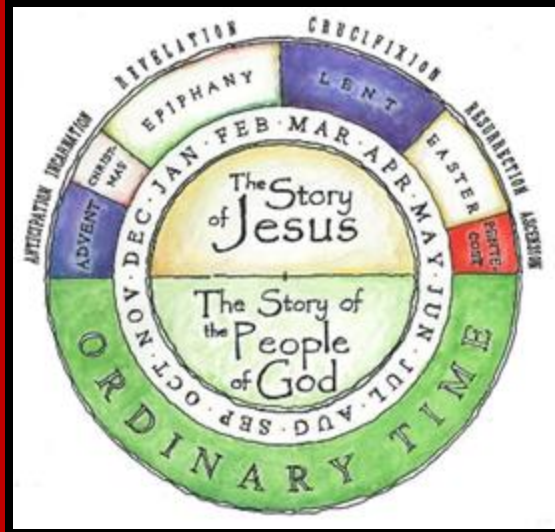

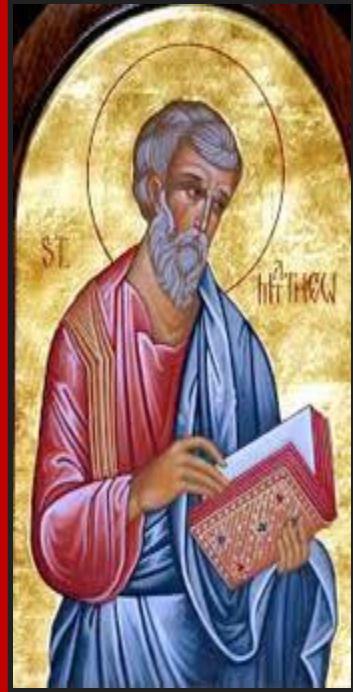
THE WORD



"As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. 'Follow me,' he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him." - Matthew 9:9

Saint Matthew's story is one of radical transformation. As a tax collector, he was likely viewed with suspicion and disdain by his community. Yet Jesus saw beyond his occupation and reputation. He saw a heart ready to respond. With just two words, **"Follow me"**- Matthew's life changed forever.

He left behind his job, wealth, and his comfort to walk with Christ. This moment reminds us that **God's call is not based on our past, but on His purpose for our future.** Matthew went on to become one of the twelve apostles and the author of one of the Gospels - a Gospel that continues to guide and inspire millions.

He was arrested for being a missionary in Japan.

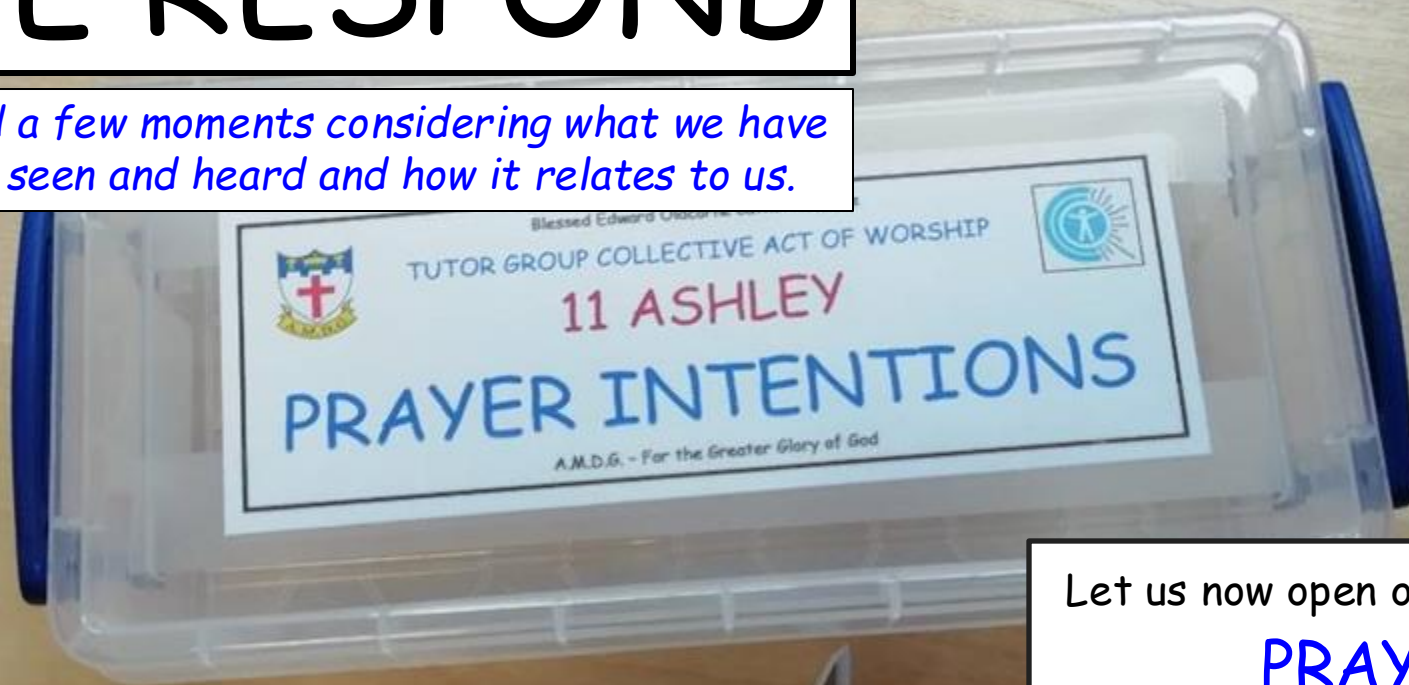
He was given the opportunity to recant, but he refused to give up his faith and eventually died after two days of suffering.

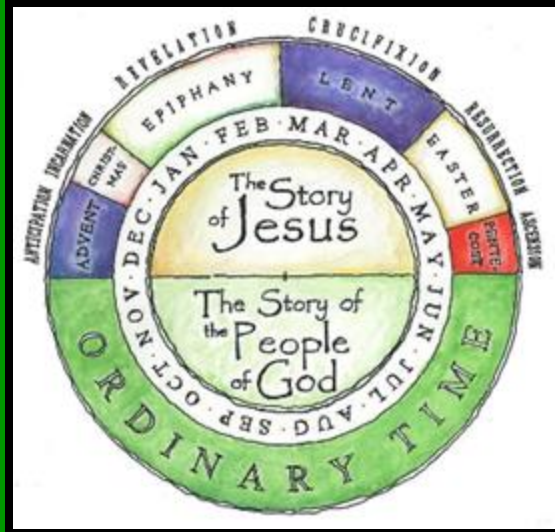

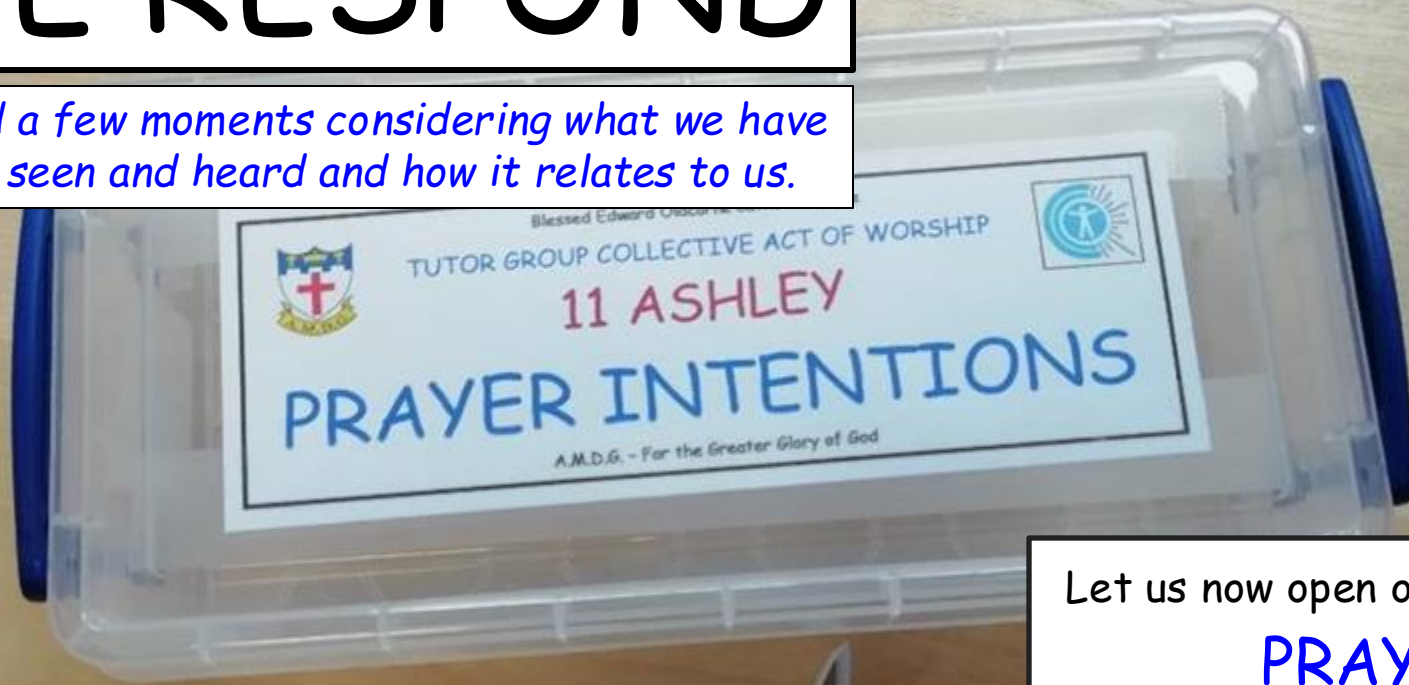
St. Francis of Assisi is one of the most beloved saints in Christian history—not because he held power or wealth, but because he gave it all up to follow Christ more closely. Born into a wealthy family, Francis chose a life of radical simplicity, humility, and joy. He saw God's presence in all of creation—in the poor, in animals, in the beauty of the earth.

Francis reminds us that **true richness is found not in possessions, but in love**—love for God, for others, and for the world around us. His life challenges us to let go of what distracts us from God and to embrace a life of peace, compassion, and service.

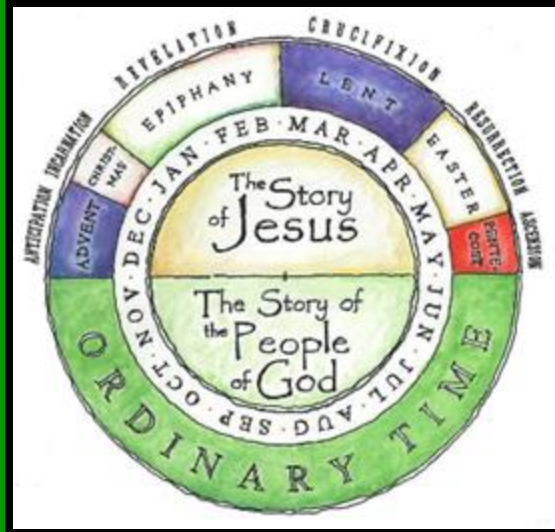

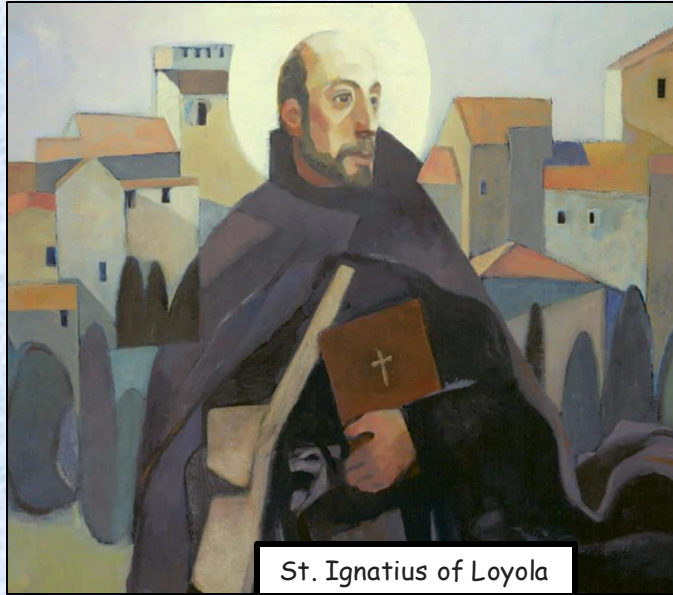

Please free my thinking and feelings and the thinking and feelings of others, from all forms of self-will, self-centeredness, dishonesty, and deception.

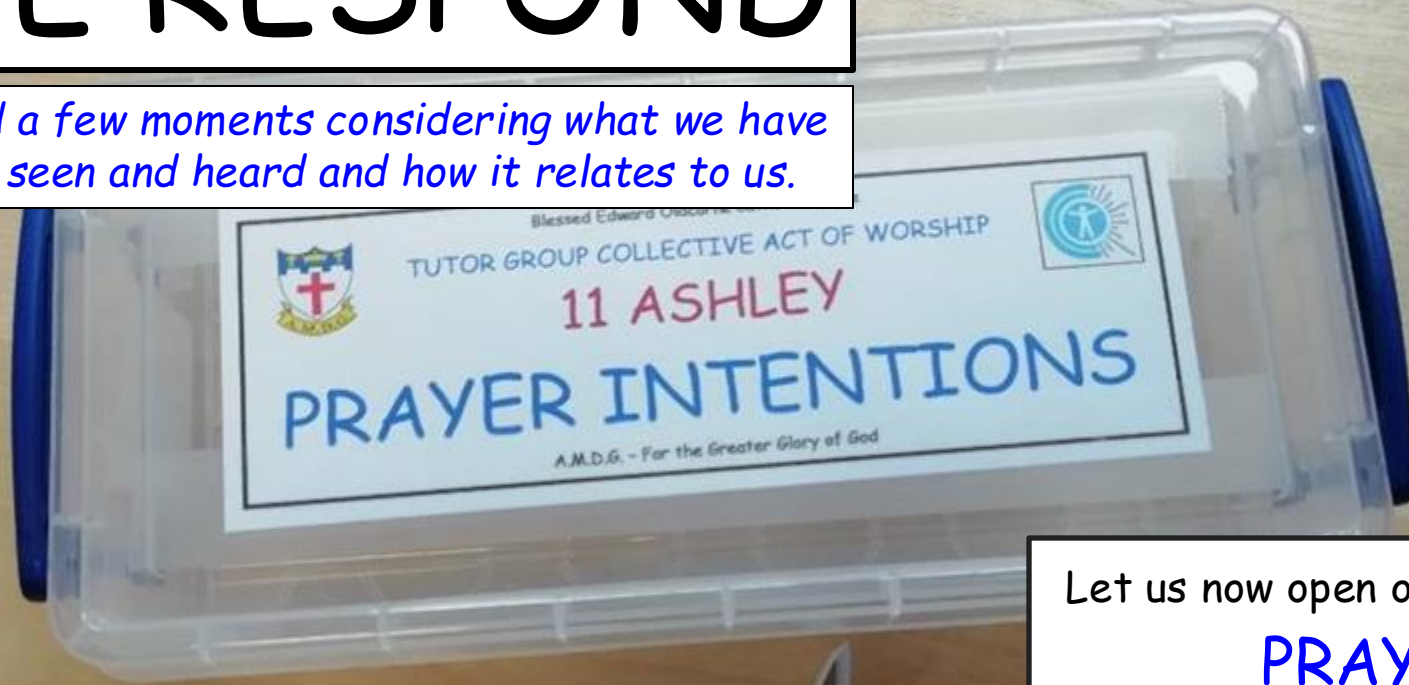
Along with my brothers and sisters, I need this freedom to make my choices today according to your desires.
