




THE WORD



They also challenge us to grow—to be loyal, honest, and kind. Camus's idea of friendship is about equality and respect: walking side by side, especially when life feels uncertain. The Bible echoes this beautifully:

"A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for a time of adversity."

— Proverbs 17:17

This verse reminds us true friends are there when things are easy, and when life gets tough. Friendship is one of the most powerful ways we can show love and build strength in each other.
