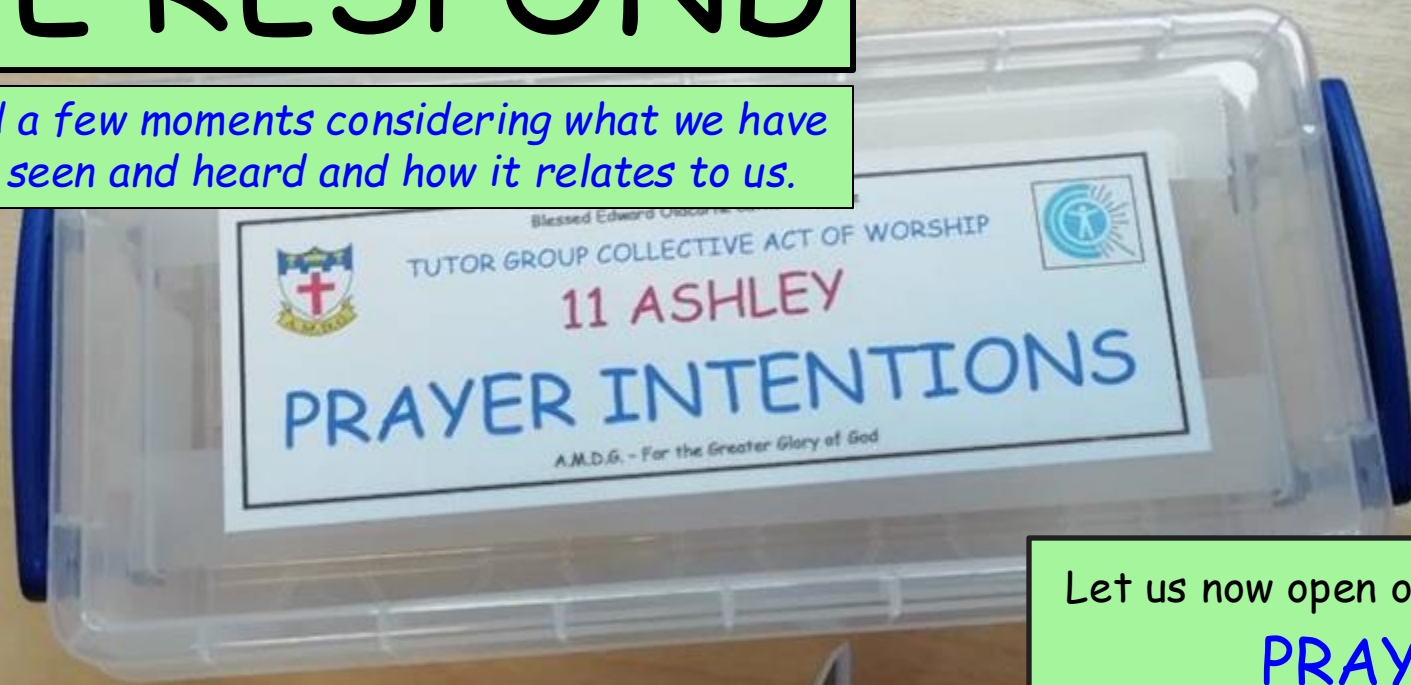

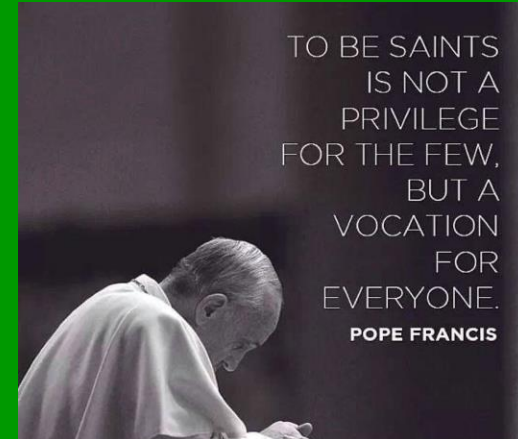


THE WORD

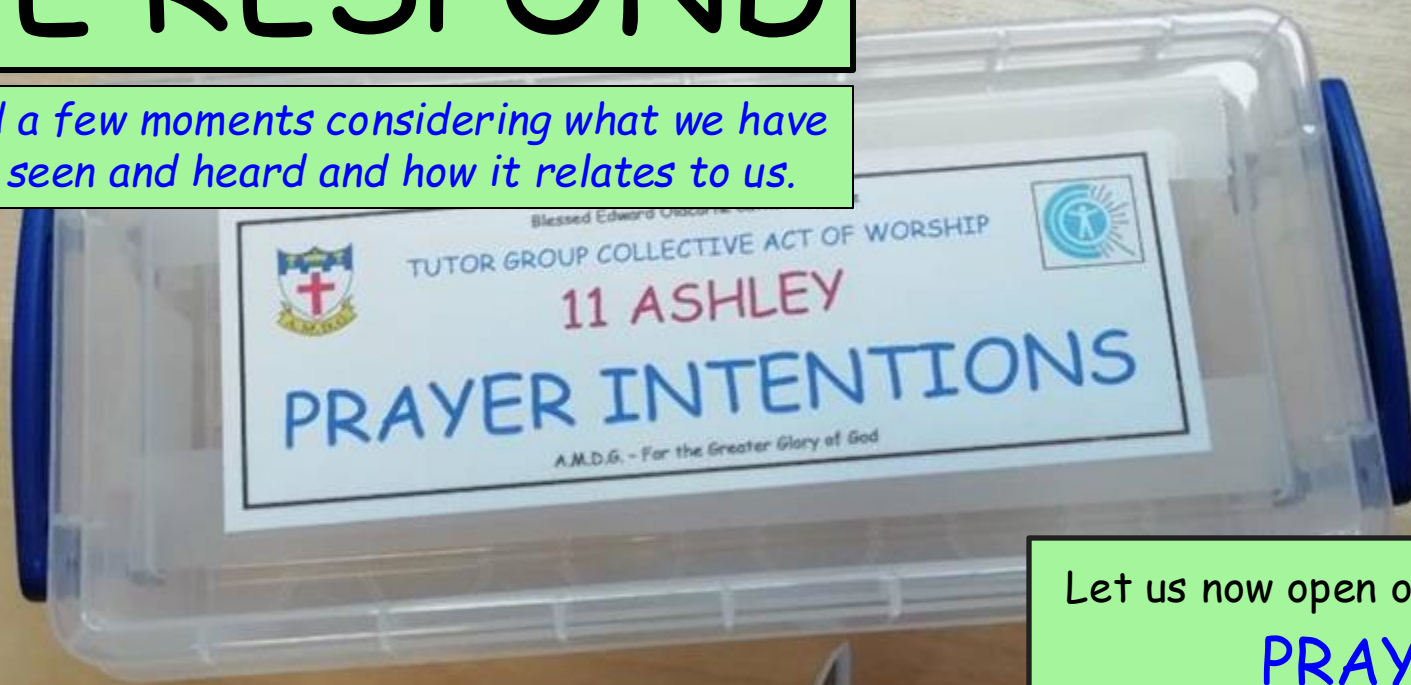

Albert Camus deeply believed in the power of human connection. He reminds us friendship isn't about control or status—it's about presence. It's about showing up for someone, not to fix them or lead them, but simply be with them.

Friendships can help us feel seen, heard, and supported. They also challenge us to grow—to be loyal, honest, and kind. Camus's idea of friendship is about equality and respect: walking side by side, especially when life feels uncertain.

The Bible echoes this beautifully:

"A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for a time of adversity."

— *Proverbs 17:17*

This verse reminds us true friends are there when things are easy, and when life gets tough. Friendship is one of the most powerful ways we can show love and build strength in each other.

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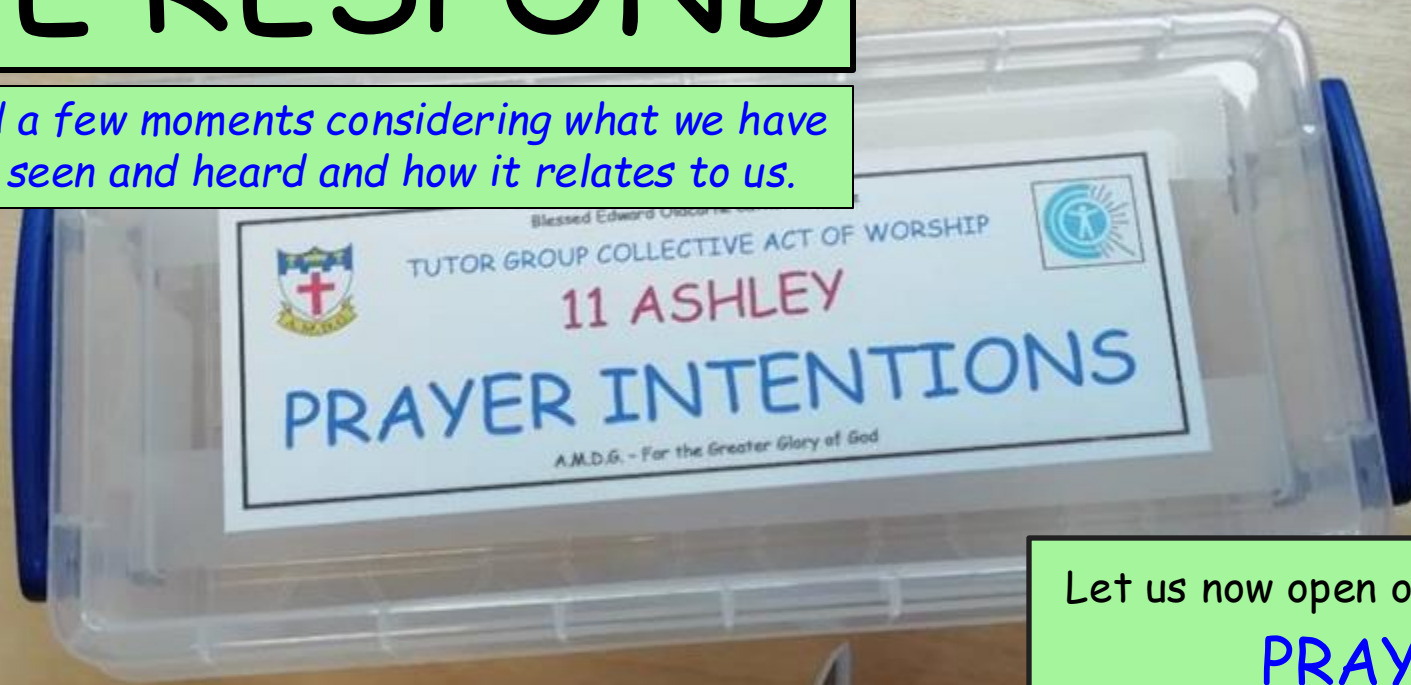

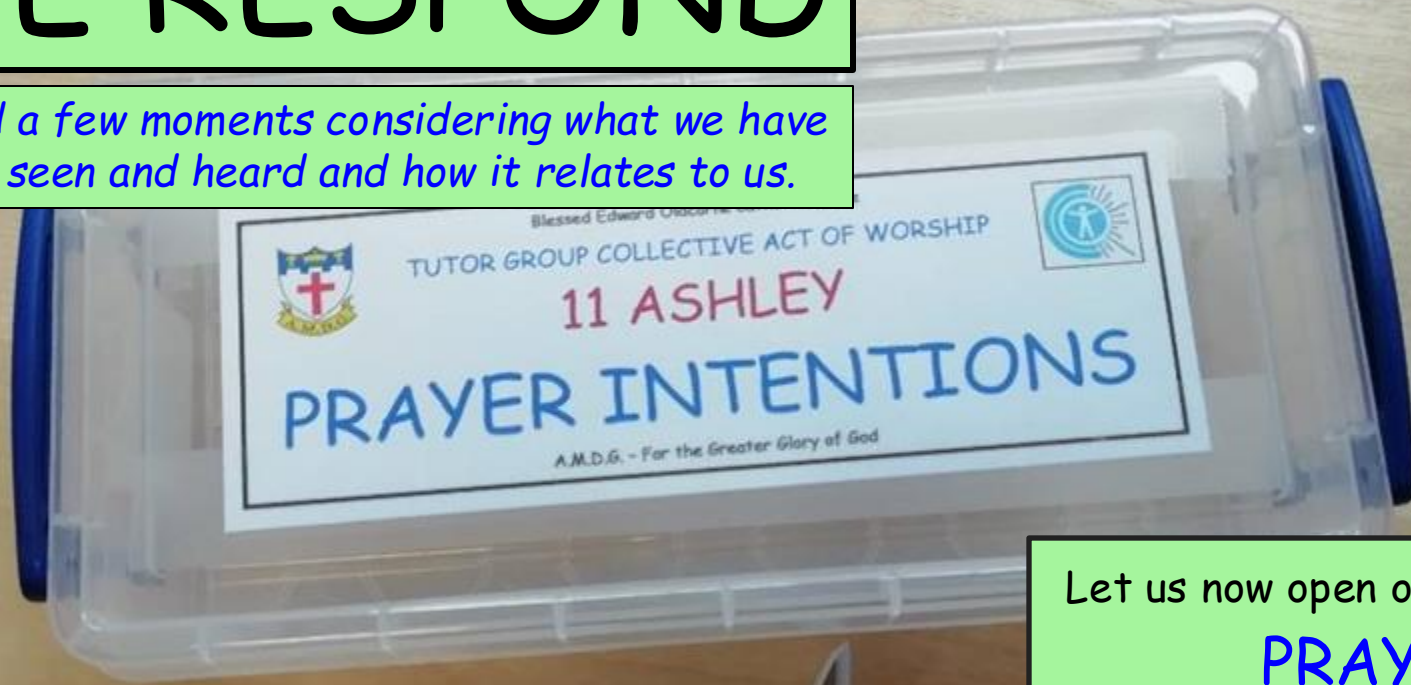

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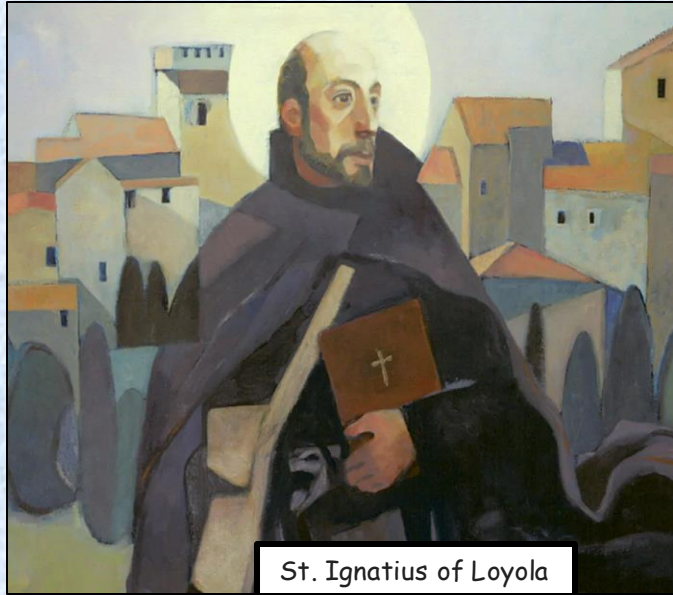

Please free my thinking and feelings and the thinking and feelings of others, from all forms of self-will, self-centeredness, dishonesty, and deception.

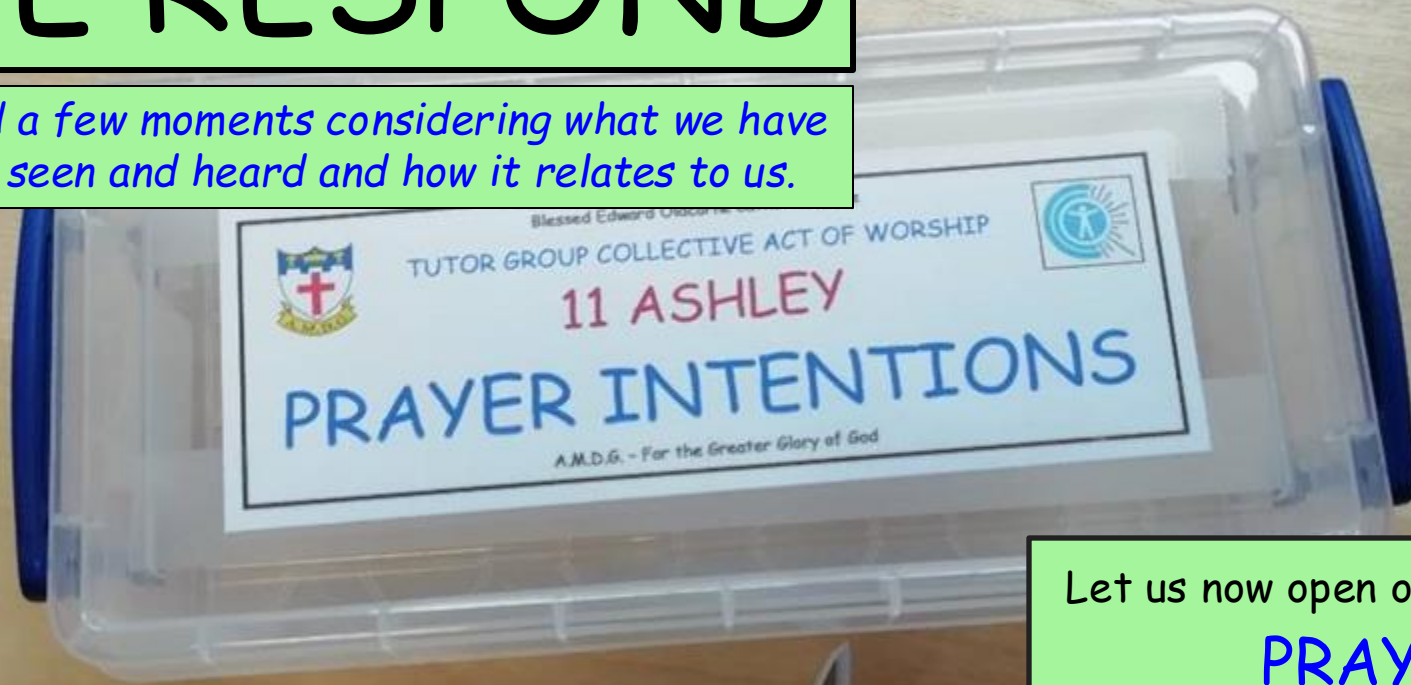
Along with my brothers and sisters, I need this freedom to make my choices today according to your desires.
