# Second Sunday of Advent

First reading

'With righteousness he shall judge the poor.'

Isaiah 11:1-10

On that day:

There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.

Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. 
