THE JOURNEY OF GLOBAL AID NETWORK (GAIN)

In 2025 GAiN is celebrating ten years! Join them on a journey through the past decade s they share stories and highlights from their work.

In 2023 GAiN UK joined with GAiN Worldwide in supporting our Water for Life Initiative, which has been providing rural villages with wells for fresh water since 2002. We do this by drilling 50-80 metres down, tapping onto the water supply and setting up a deep-capped well. Alongside the construction, GAiN provides training on hygiene and sanitation practices, gender sensitivity and community health. In the second year of the project in the UK, we were able to fund our first well, thanks to some generous donors. Not only that, but we sent a group of people to Benin and they had the privilege of laying the concrete pad for this well's foundation. Not only that, they were also able to help in every stage of the process in different villages, from digging to drilling, laying the foundation, flushing the well and finishing a complete well.

Next Sunday's
Mass Readings
Isaiah 35:1-6a,10;
Psalm 146(145);
James 5:7-10;
Matthew 11:2-11

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

The Gospel this weekend begins in a peculiar way. Some 2000 years after the birth of Jesus we are still interested in Jesus, not just the historical person of Jesus or some ancient geography. But these details reveal something crucial to us about Jesus, who is not an abstract God. He weaves His action and His presence into the very fabric of our lives. He is present in the personal history of you and me. Our God is one who enjoys a personal relationship with us; He is not a mere distant deity. This is evident in the invitation of John the Baptist in the Gospel passage today. The central theme of the liturgy is a call to "Prepare the way of the Lord" through repentance and a change of heart. It emphasizes that true preparation involves transforming our inner lives and relationships, moving away from selfishness and towards a life of social consciousness, justice and love for our neighbour. John the Baptist's message is a stark call to make our spiritual lives more than just rituals; it's about producing the "fruit" of a renewed life, such as kindness, honesty and forgiveness, to prepare for Christ's coming. The famous English poet Alexander Pope once said, "What does it profit me if Jesus is born in thousands of Christmas Cribs all over the world but not in my own heart?" Indeed, Jesus wants to enter into our heart, He wants to enter into our story, to bring us love, to bring us mercy and peace. This is not just for us to keep as private treasures, but so that we can in turn give to others as well.

As we are getting closer to the closing of the Jubilee Year of Pilgrims of Hope, this Sunday calls us to reflect on the special theme of peace. For the people of Israel peace and hope were the fruits of the Jubilee Year (Leviticus 25), a year of rest and reflection that had economic and social significance such as land restoration, through which all ancestral lands were returned to their original families, reinforcing the idea that God, not individuals, is the ultimate owner of the land. Debt cancellation provided economic amnesty by forgiving debts. By liberation of slaves indentured servants, who had become enslaved due to debt, were set free. Preservation of family and community was secured by restoring land and freeing people from servitude. The Jubilee aimed to keep families whole and prevent the long-term consequences of poverty and debt. There was also spiritual significance in rest and renewal. Like the sabbatical year, the Jubilee was a holy year for the land to rest and be rejuvenated, symbolizing a time of rest and renewal for the people as well. There was also an expression of God's justice and mercy, which demonstrated God's concern for the poor and marginalized. There is also spiritual fulfilment: Jesus is identified in Isaiah 61 and Luke 4 as the Messiah who brings liberation to captives, ending of debts and spiritual freedom. These are significant details of the Jubilee which are relevant for us all in this year of jubilee too.

Advent is the time for us to make this preparation for spiritual freedom by repenting of our sins and renewing our lives through prayer, penance and sharing our blessings with others. This is a time of homecoming to rediscover our identity as children of God. Sin disfigures our identity, because it is an offence against reason, truth and right conscience; it is failure in genuine love for God and neighbour caused by a perverse attachment to certain things, behaviour and belief. It wounds the nature of man and injures human solidarity. It is a desire contrary to the eternal law. Therefore, during this Advent, let us stay awake so that nothing can disfigure our true identity as Christians.
