# THE WORD




Today, 6th January 2026, is the Feast of the Epiphany, when the 3 Wise Men visited the baby Jesus.

Epiphany means “revealing.” It’s a moment when the light of Christ is made known to all nations.

The Epiphany celebrates the visit of the Magi—wise men from the East—who followed a star to find the newborn Jesus. Their journey reminds us that Christ came not just for one group of people, but for the whole world. The gifts they brought were symbols of honour, worship, and sacrifice.

Fleming's discovery of penicillin in 1928 was a turning point in medical history. His work saved millions of lives and continues to impact healthcare today. His discovery came through careful observation, curiosity, and a deep commitment to helping others.

He didn't seek fame—he sought solutions. His story reminds us that even quiet dedication can lead to world-changing results. It also teaches that talents, no matter how small they seem, can be used to serve others and bring healing.

The scripture reminds us we are called to be stewards of the gifts we've been given. Whether in science, art, kindness, or leadership, we can make a difference when we use our abilities with purpose and compassion.
