






THE WORD


"We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure." — Hebrews 6:19




THE WORD

"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." - Matthew 25:40

Albert Schweitzer was born on this day in 1865. He became a world-famous organist and author and sacrificed a comfortable life in France and Germany to be a missionary doctor. In Africa he set up a hospital and leper-colony for the very poor.

He encouraged others to share his "reverence for life", growing in compassion for life in all its forms. He wrote: **"By having reverence for life, we enter into a spiritual relationship with the world."**

He helped lead others to see that, with love and compassion and respect for all life, people would find a greater meaning in their lives. In 1952 Doctor Albert Schweitzer was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.





Martin Luther King, the American Civil Rights leader, was born on this day in 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia, in the southern United States. 2 In the United States in 1955, people were still kept apart because of the colour of their skin.

Martin Luther King was one of the Christian leaders who opposed the laws and the attitude of discrimination, and he would eventually pay for it with his life, even though he was fully committed himself to non-violence. He said: "**Love is the only force capable of transforming an enemy into a friend.**"







Please free my thinking and feelings and the thinking and feelings of others, from all forms of self-will, self-centeredness, dishonesty, and deception.


