

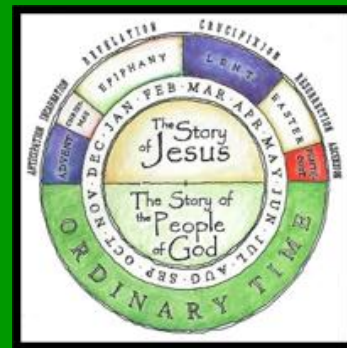
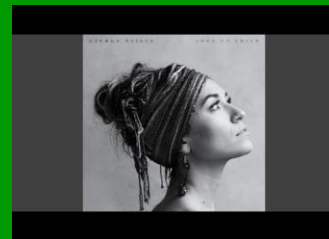

THE WORD



In Sunday's Gospel we read: *"When Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, he withdrew to Galilee. Leaving Nazareth, he went and lived in Capernaum, which was by the lake in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali."* — Matthew 4:12-13

These verses mark a turning point: John's ministry ends, and Jesus begins His public mission. He moves to Galilee—a region considered spiritually dark and distant from Jerusalem's religious center. Yet this is where the light of the world chooses to shine first. It reminds us that God often works in unexpected places and among ordinary people.

When life feels uncertain or overshadowed by difficulty, remember: Jesus steps into the very places that seem far from hope. His presence transforms darkness into light.

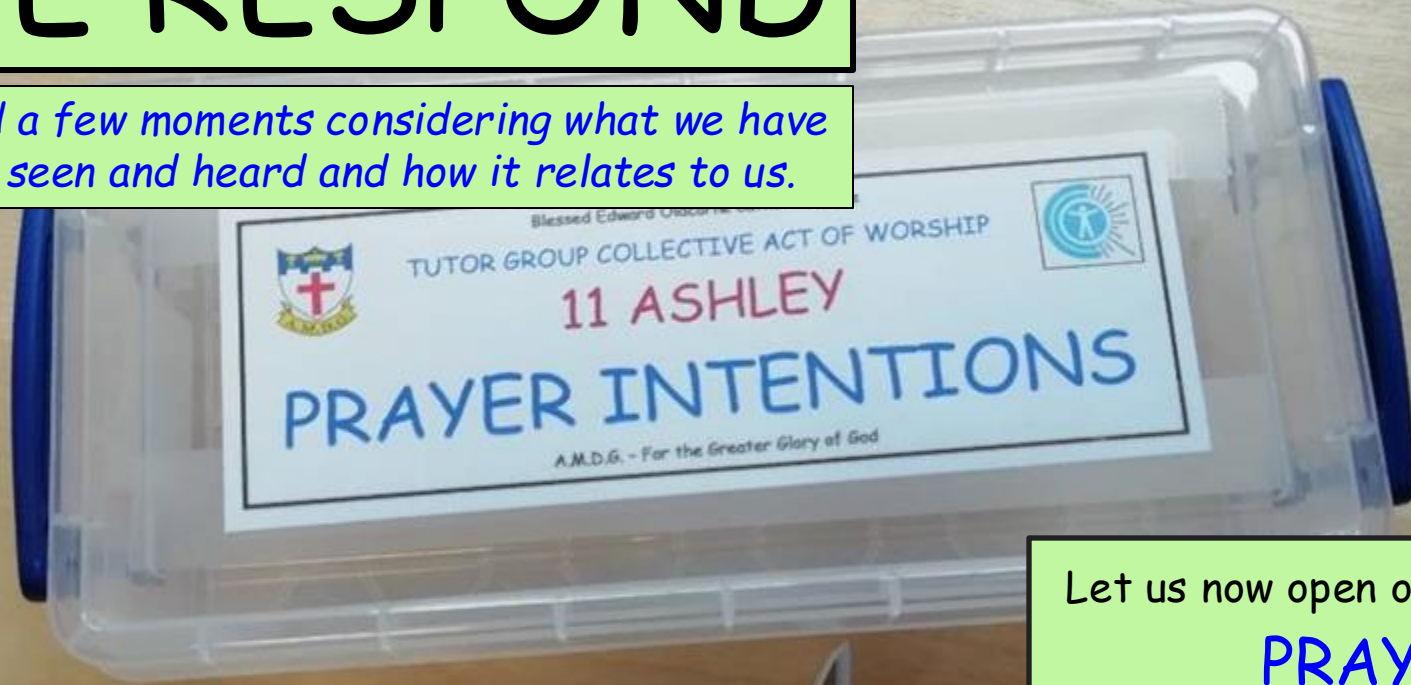

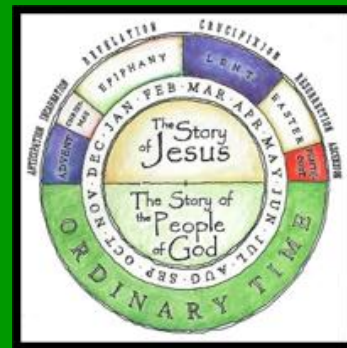

HOLOCAUST
MEMORIAL

"He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."
— Micah 6:8

Today we pause to remember the millions of lives lost during one of history's darkest chapters. We honor their memory and commit ourselves to stand against hatred, prejudice, and injustice in all its forms.

The Holocaust reminds us of the devastating consequences when humanity turns away from justice, mercy, and humility. Micah's words call us to live differently—to be people who seek justice for the oppressed, show mercy to the vulnerable, and walk humbly before God. In remembering, we renew our commitment to these values so that such evil may never happen again.

THE WORD

"Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you life as your victor's crown." —
Revelation 2:10

Today we honor Blessed Edward Oldcorne, a Jesuit priest who remained steadfast in his faith during a time of persecution in England. Though falsely accused and executed in 1606, his life reminds us of the courage to stand firm in truth and love, even when it costs everything.

Blessed Edward Oldcorne lived out these words with unwavering faith. He did not seek fame or power, but simply desired to serve God and His people. His martyrdom calls us to examine our own lives: Are we willing to remain faithful in the face of trials? Do we trust that God's promise of eternal life outweighs any earthly suffering?

Please free my thinking and feelings and the thinking and feelings of others, from all forms of self-will, self-centeredness, dishonesty, and deception.

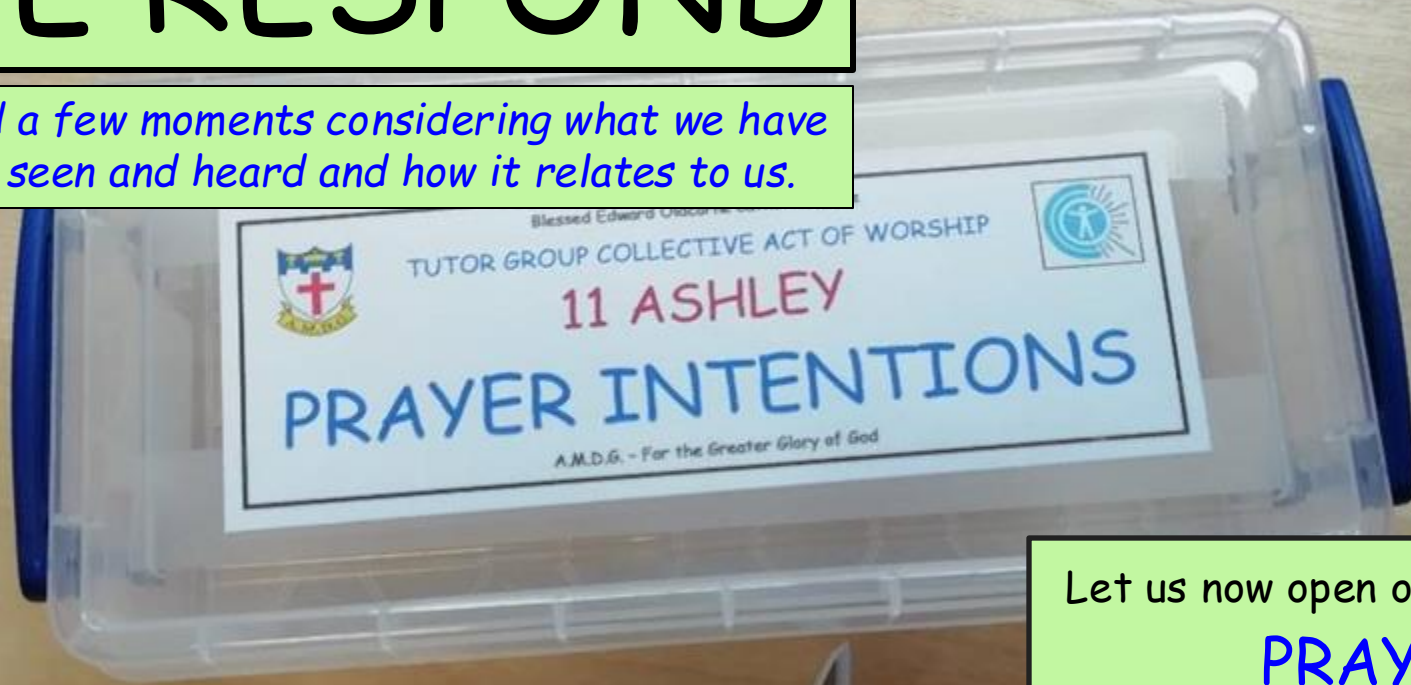
