I hope you and your family enjoyed a wonderful Christmas break and a restful start to the New Year. It has been lovely to welcome Year 10 students back to College, ready to build on the successes they have achieved so far. The start of a new year is always a great opportunity for reflection and for setting fresh goals.

One of the key targets I have shared with students is to raise our year group attendance to 95%. Currently, attendance stands at 91.3%, which is a fall of 1.2% compared to the same point last year. Research consistently shows that strong attendance is a clear indicator of academic success. Put simply: if students are not in school, they are not learning. While 90% attendance may sound positive, it actually equates to one day off every fortnight, a level most employers would not accept. We greatly appreciate your continued support in encouraging excellent attendance. I would also like to congratulate the 91 students who currently have attendance above 96%.

Our house system continues to grow, offering a wide range of competitions and activities for students to enjoy. As spring approaches, the PE department will expand its sports clubs, and our teaching staff remain committed to innovative approaches that inspire learning.
